PITCH FOR \$K

In partnership with the Flint & Genesee Group, 100K Ideas launched the 3rd year of the Pitch For \$K - Idea Pitch Competition. This was made possible with the generous support of the Charles Stewart Mott Foundation. In addition, we added NorthGate, FlintPrints, and the Hagerman Foundation Fund of the Community Foundation of Greater Flint as supporters of the competition.

The third competition of this year's series was held on May 11 during the Flint and Genesee Group's monthly Luncheon and live-streamed on Facebook for viewers to tune in. In addition to the first, second, and third-place prizes of \$5,000, \$2,500, and \$1,000, respectively, a People's Choice prize in the amount of \$1,000 is also awarded to a lucky participant by the in-person and viewing audience.

Six finalists were selected to participate in the event. In preparation for the competition, they were paired with mentors and provided a pitch clinic, facilitated by the University of Michigan Flint's Office of Economic Development. Walking away with the top prize of \$5,000 was Terrin Bryant with "The Water Bell". Second place and People's Choice Winner was awarded to Robert Walker and Auston Pariseu with "Gas Money" winning a total of \$3,500. The Third place was awarded to Charlie Dobson for "We Swim Aquatics".

Submissions are now open for the next Pitch For \$K competition scheduled for September 22nd, 2022. ORGANIZATIONAL SKILLS

Organizational skills is great to possess. The discipline happens to be exhibited as the activity of prioritizing, arranging, and structuring your daily tasks or operations in a neat manner. TIP #1: PRIORITIZE YOUR TASKS

Conduct an agenda list, write down the most important tasks with the closest deadlines, and place it at the top of the list. 
TIP #3: SCHEDULE ONE TASK AND EVENT AT A TIME

We track services provides as follows: the idea stage comprised of a 30 minute free intake session to discuss the client's idea, a full binder assessment including concept art, research & benchmarking, market analytics and possible next steps, and work orders which can be for an array of services offered including prototyping, branding or product distribution.
